Next Generation 2024-2025 Programme Information



Introduction

Next Generation is a free support, development and training programme for young people aged 16-24 who are in the early stages of their working lives as practitioners in the arts, and who have a particular connection to youth theatre.

Delivered by Youth Theatre Arts Scotland (YTAS), the Next Generation programme will bring together **a cohort of 15-20 early career practitioners** to develop foundational leadership skills and professional knowledge which will allow them to thrive as youth theatre assistants, leaders, artists and future arts managers.

Programme participants will be invited to take part in online and in-person training and development activity on a part-time basis **between November 2024 and June 2025**.

One element of the **training is accredited at SCQF Level 3** (see below) and once this is achieved, participants will have the opportunity to continue on their Next Generation journey for a second year (until June 2026). This second year will lead to an **SCQF Level 6** qualification.

Participants in the Next Generation cohort will become independent, active and confident individuals with the skills and abilities to realise their career potential, and to bring new ideas, aspiration and advocacy to Scotland's youth theatre sector.

Who can apply to take part?

The Next Generation Programme is for you if...

- You are between 16-24 years old.
- You are interested in pursuing an arts career that includes youth theatre leadership.

- You have assisted in the delivery of youth theatre workshops/sessions or have started to deliver on your own and want to learn more to develop your practice.
- You are interested in developing your skills in youth theatre facilitation, lesson planning, youth work essentials, and more.
- You are interested in joining a community and support network of fellow early career practitioners.
- You want to engage regularly with a youth theatre local to you.

What are the benefits of taking part?

In year one, the Next Generation Programme will offer you...

- A <u>SCQF Level 3</u> qualification (on completion of the 'Ready for Youth Theatre' course delivered by YTAS and Youth Scotland).
- Free <u>YTAS membership</u> for a year.
- Four-to-six online **professional development workshops** delivered by leading industry practitioners.
- A free **residential weekend** where you will connect with fellow programme participants and share your practice (late June 2025).
- Up to three online or in-person **mentoring sessions** with Next Generation Coordinator, Drew Taylor-Wilson.
- Two online or in-person **advice sessions** with a YTAS staff member to explore your rights as a freelancer or employee, or to explore setting up your own company.
- An in-person **work placement** with a local youth theatre or at a youth theatre festival.
- Free places at all YTAS in-person events from November 2024 to June 2025. To include <u>Regional Training Hubs</u> and <u>Interchange</u>.
- The opportunity to take part in **theatre trips** and **in-person workshops** with fellow Next Generation participants.

In year two, the Next Generation Programme will offer you...

- A further qualification at <u>SCQF Level 6</u> (by completing the Professional Development Award course delivered by YTAS and Youth Scotland).
- Further online and in-person **professional development workshops** and **theatre trips**.
- Further **mentoring** with YTAS staff and the Next Generation Coordinator.
- **Free places** at all YTAS in-person events from November 2025 to June 2026, including Regional Training Hubs and the National Convention of Youth Drama.

What's the time commitment?

Compulsory participation

To join the Next Generation Programme you will need to commit to...

- Attending an introductory online session on Thursday 21 November 2024, from 6-8pm.
- Attending at least two professional development workshops throughout the year. You will be able to book each workshop separately.
- Attending two online mentoring or development meetings with the Next Generation Coordinator or a member of the YTAS staff team.
- Attending all necessary online workshops (approximately six throughout the programme) and completing a reflective portfolio as part of your SCQF Level 3 'Ready for Youth Theatre' course.
- Attending a Next Generation Programme in-person Residential Weekend.

Optional Participation

- While in-person work placements with local youth theatres are not compulsory, you will be encouraged to engage directly with an existing group to get the most out of this development opportunity. The Next Generation staff team will work with you (and a local youth theatre) group to establish the most appropriate way for a placement to happen.
- While we hope that all Next Generation participants choose to stay on the programme for year two, this is not a requirement for entry to year one.

Access Support

The Next Generation Programme is designed with access at its core. We want to help early career practitioners of all backgrounds, and from all across Scotland, achieve their professional goals. We will work with you individually to find ways to make sure that taking part can be as accessible as possible for you.

Please note...

- There will be one or two activities each month which you will be invited to join. These will vary in length from two hours to a full day. 80% of the activity will take place online.
- We are committed to helping you to coordinate attending any in-person activity you want to take part in.
- Most online professional development workshops will take place in the evening to accommodate studies and day jobs.
- Travel and accommodation costs for the Residential Weekend will be covered by YTAS.
- Access Bursaries to cover travel and accommodation for other Next Generation Programme in-person events are available on application to YTAS at the time of the event.
- You will be invited to tell us about any personal access requirements you may have. These could include:
 - One-to-one support to compile your portfolio.
 - BSL support.
 - An access support worker.
 - Support with expenses and invoice administration.
 - Outlines of workshops provided in advance.
 - Being able to talk through any programme activity in advance with a YTAS staff member.

Application Questions

- 1. Why are you interested in pursuing a career in youth theatre? (maximum 200 words)
- 2. Tell us a bit about your experience that you think is relevant to joining the Next Generation Programme (maximum 300 words)

This could be details of previous employment or voluntary positions. It could be details of your participation in youth theatre/engagement activity, or anything else you think is relevant.

3. What do you think makes a good youth theatre leader? (maximum 100 words)

Your application will help us make sure that the Next Generation programme is a good fit for you. It will also help us start to identify pathways and collaborative partners that could be of particular interest to you.

Thursday 5 December 2024 6-8pm (online)	Shadow Puppetry Basics This online workshop will explore how to elevate your storytelling through shadow puppetry. We will build puppets with materials you can find around your house and explore creative ways to 'catch' and 'throw' shadows.
Thursday 9 January 2024 6-8pm (online)	Creating Autobiographical Theatre This online workshop will explore tools and exercises for generating performance from autobiographical material. Together we'll take part in practical exercises while discussing how to safeguard your groups when generating material linked to identities and personal experiences.
