Workshop Programme

Interchange workshops will focus on the creative process. Event attendees will take part in two out of the three workshops on offer, one on Saturday and one on Sunday. The YTAS team will remind you of your selections on the day.

The Co-Creation Playspace | Ned Glasier

Let's play! Join Ned Glasier in a four-hour explorative workshop for any artists and facilitators who lead co-creation projects to make and play, free from the pressure of leadership, room management and having to be 'good'. The workshop will involve playing games and making things; to experience a co-creation process as a participant and regain your sense of creative freedom.

If you've attended a co-creation course with Ned before, this workshop will be a great opportunity to put theory into practice and deepen your understanding of the source to performance process. If you haven't, it's a great introduction to the work.

About the facilitator

Ned Glasier has created projects and plays for theatres including the Young Vic, Almeida Theatre, Southwark Playhouse, Theatre for a Change (Ghana).

From 2008-2024, Ned was the founding Artistic Director of Company Three, a multi-award winning youth theatre and Arts Council England National Portfolio Organisation in North London. At Company Three, he pioneered a new approach to co-creation and developed more than 40 plays that helped teenagers express themselves on everything from exam stress to the future of our planet.

Ned has developed an exchange programme around the practice of co-creation, publishing blueprints (devising guides) to support more than 500 other groups around the world make their own version of Company Three's plays.

Since leaving Company Three, Ned has continued to deliver training for artists, practitioners and teachers around the world and has created projects with London Museum, Crescent Arts Centre (Belfast), FOBISIA (Asia), Alphabetti (Newcastle), and Stellar Quines (Kirkcaldy). He is currently working on developing a number of new artistic projects and writing a book about co-creation with young people.

Embodied Stories | Birgit Freitag

The body is the central element in the work of choreographer Birgit Freitag. In this workshop, she will give an insight in various choreographic principles and improvisation scores, she has found and developed in the course of her creative work in order to create dance productions with professionals as well as with children, young people and amateurs.

This workshop is not primarily about dance or a specific dance technique, but about bodies that explore, play, touch, tell... You will look at some exemplary exercises, methods and scene materials from the production process of various dance productions by Birgit Freitag. The workshop offers an insight into methods for researching and developing creative processes, both in groups and in duets and solos. At the end of the workshop, participants are invited to make these experiments their own and develop their own choreographic ideas.

The YTAS team are delighted to bring Birgit to Scotland after attending her workshop as part of the German Artists' Lab during our Creative Europe funded international BUZZ Network project.

About the facilitator

Birgit Freitag is a freelance choreographer from Bremen. She founded *every friday | dance production* in 2000. Under this label, she develops independent works in the fields of dance, theatre and performance. Her choreographic focus is on interdisciplinary movement research - in her pieces she works with both professional performers and people who are not trained for the stage. For JUNGES.THEATERBREMEN, she has been choreographing plays for a young audience with professional performers as well as with young people since 2016.

With her artistic work she has been invited to various festivals and guest performances. Her production *Eins zu Eins* was one of ten outstanding productions invited to the *Augenblick Mal! 2017* festival in Berlin. In addition to her independent work, Birgit has directed for JUNGES.THEATERBREMEN, Theater an der Parkaue Berlin, Staatstheater Saarbrücken, Oldenburgisches Staatstheater, Staatstheater Dresden and Theater Bielefeld, among others. Her production *Für Vier* for JUNGES.THEAERBREMEN won the German theatre prize DER FAUST 2019.

Text with Teenagers | Wonder Fools

Join the Wonder Fools team for *Text with Teenagers*, an engaging workshop as part of this year's programme exploring the relationship between youth theatres and the education sector. A workshop perfect for drama teachers and youth theatre practitioners, this interactive session will offer practical tools and fresh approaches to finding, preparing, and developing texts for teenage performers.

Building on the success of *Positive Stories for Negative Times*, this workshop will provide insight into Wonder Fools' collaborative approach to working with young people and professional writers. Over the four hours, you'll delve into...

- Selecting the Right Texts: How to find or create material that resonates with teenagers, balancing creativity, relevance, and performance potential.
- Preparing Texts for Young Performers: Techniques to adapt, workshop, and prepare texts for rehearsals, ensuring they are accessible and engaging for your group.
- Creating Your Own Texts: Explore innovative models for developing original texts collaboratively with young people and writers, sparking creativity in your own projects.

Whether you're looking to inspire your drama students with new material or keen to develop your own collaborative methods, this workshop will equip you with practical strategies and fresh perspectives.

About the facilitators

Wonder Fools are a socially engaged theatre company who have been working since 2017 to deliver high quality arts projects through their three strands: Co-creation with young people and communities, artist development, and creative engagement projects.

Based in Glasgow, their reach has extended across Scotland, the UK, and around the world. Wonder Fools' work encompasses various communities in Scotland with strategic focus areas including East Lothian, Dumfries and Galloway, Ayrshire, Perthshire and the Highlands. They tour their productions and projects throughout Scotland and have a broader national and international presence through *Positive Stories for Negative Times*.

By Train

The nearest train station is **Cumbernauld**, which is served by trains from Glasgow Queen Street and Falkirk Grahamston or Camelon. To plan your journey by train or bus visit Travel Line Scotland.

It is a 15 to 20-minute walk to Lanternhouse from Cumbernauld station.



By Bus

There is a bus stop directly outside the venue on Kildrum Road.

Bus number **X25** from Glasgow departs from Buchanan Street Bus Station and takes around 30mins. To plan your journey by train or bus visit <u>Travel Line Scotland</u>.



By Car

If driving is required, Lanternhouse (G67 2UF) is easily accessible by road and free parking is available on site.

Did you know... lift sharing is one of the easiest ways for drivers to reduce their CO2 emissions? To encourage more sustainable travel, we've set up a <u>car sharing page on Caroster</u> to help people share lifts to Interchange.

For those able to offer a lift to other event attendees from your area, you can use the page to list a suitable pick-up point and time.

- Click on the +Add a trip button
- Input your details (including your name, phone number, seats available, estimated timings and pick-up location), and add a message into the Notes section.
- Passengers can then contact you directly to join your trip.

For those looking for a lift, follow instructions on the page to add your route to the list.

- Check the Trips page to see if anyone has already offered a lift from/passing through your location. If so, you can contact them directly using the phone number provided to join their trip.
- If your location is not yet listed, click on the Waiting list page and add your details to the list to share where you're hoping to travel from. You'll receive a notification when someone offers space in their car. Keep an eye on the page and use the contact details provided to connect with other attendees and arrange your lift.
